dedicated and inspiring leaders and teachers who have helped shape university education in Canada for almost three decades.

STLHE and 3M Canada will officially welcome these ten extraordinary university and college teachers into the Fellowship at its annual conference, hosted this year in by the University of Manitoba, Red River College and Université de Saint-Boniface in Winnipeg.
