- *Snack Bites* carried forward into 2024, building on the successes and momentum of the previous year.






MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

In 2024, our flagship journal, the *Canadian Journal for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning* (CJSoTL) published three issues within their 15th volume. Thanks to Brett McCollum, Ken Meadows and the wider editorial team for their ongoing dedication to the realm of academic publishing. 2024 also marked the publication of the 15th volume of the Collected Essays in Teaching and Learning (CELT), highlighting the work from our 2022 conference. Thank you to Sarah Driessens and your team for your continued hard work. A new green guide "from the students' perspective" was also released; written by the 2023 cohort of 3M National Student Fellows; as well as a magazine to SPARK joy and creativity in teaching by the 2023 National Teaching Fellows.

THE CANADIAN JOURNAL FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP OF TEACHING AND LEARNING (CJSOTL)

The Canadian Journal for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (CJSoTL) / La revue canadienne sur l'avancement des connaissances en enseignement et en apprentissage (RCACEA) has celebrated another banner year in 2024. At the time that I am writing this, Issue 15.3 is being finalized and will be our largest issue to date. In total, CJSoTL will publish more articles in 2024 than any previous year: 59 articles. That is nearly double (190%) the number of articles published annually only five years ago. As a volunteer-led, no-fee publishing, open-access venue, this has been no small feat!

The higher submission rates observed during the past few years have continued. To maintain responsive timelines, we have emphasized the submission criteria shared on our website. This has reduced past delays in getting manuscripts through our internal editorial review and out to peer reviewers. With the increasing volume of high-quality manuscripts within our processes, we are continuing to find new ways to adapt and innovate. We aim to support authors in receiving a final response within 14 months. During 2024, because of our collective efforts, including the contributions of our community of peer reviewers, we have expedited our processes with the average manuscript transitioning from submission to acceptance in less than seven months!

We are anticipating that next year there will again be three large issues. This high level of interest in publishing with CJSoTL is exciting and reflects the continued growth of the SoTL community in Canada. To support this level of activity within our processes, a new position for the production side-of-house is being designed for 2025. This individual will work closely with our Managing Editor on articles accepted for publication. Watch your inbox for this exciting opportunity to contribute to the work of the Journal.

Thank you to all our authors and reviewers. Thank you to all those who concluded their service with the Journal this year, who continue to serve, and to those who have joined our team. Your contributions keep the business of the Journal moving forward.

COLLECTED ESSAYS ON LEARNING AND TEACHING (CELT)

CELT's 15th volume was published on March 28, 2024. The most recent edition features peer-reviewed papers originally presented at the 40th face-to-face STLHE Conference *Reconnecting and Reconstructing: Perspectives on Teaching and Learning* that took place on the unceded traditional territory of the Algonquin Anishinaabeg People from June 7-10, 2022. This issue was long awaited by the 26 brilliant and patient authors that comprised this edition titled *A Renewed Commitment: Enhancing Opportunities for Scholars of Teaching and Learning*. CELT is working diligently to release Volume 16 in spring 2025.

MOHAMMAD ASADI LARI COUNCIL OF FELLOWS SCHOLARSHIP

In 2020, Mohammad Asadi Lari (3M National Student Fellow, 2018) was one of the individuals who lost his life on Flight 752, shot down near Tehran, Iran. At that time, Mohammad was in his second year of an eight-year MD/PhD program at the University of Toronto. When Mohammad's 3M NSF cohort thinks of him, the words compassionate and dedicated come to mind. In memory of Mohammad, the Council of Fellows established the Mohammad Asadi Lari Council of Fellows Scholarship of \$1,000.00 to cover the cost of registration and other expenses for one recipient to attend the Society for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education (STLHE) annual conference (cost and location vary each year).

The 2024 recipient is Georges-Philippe Gadoury-Sansfaçon.

Sole Grant

The SoLE Grant program supports educational leadership initiatives in Canadian Higher Education. The Council of National Fellows for Excellence in Teaching and Learning (Council of Fellows) recognizes the unique leadership contribution made by not only Fellows but by all our colleagues. In this spirit, and as a counterpoint to the more familiar Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL), the Scholarship of Leadership in Education (SoLE) grant program was launched in 2014 to support, mobilize, and celebrate the efforts of educational leaders across Canada. It augments the Council's ability to engage and sustain this crucial aspect of Teaching and Learning.
